There's a new handicap system. The World Handicap System (WHS) - <https://ncga.org/world-handicap-system/> will be implemented beginning January 2020. The WHS combines the existing six different handicap systems into one which means when you're golfing at St. Andrews in Scotland, your handicap will be the same. ☺ Take a look at the link above to find more information, you can also download a manual for late night reading.
